





15th Annual Walk with L'Arche on May 5th

The 15th annual **Vickar Automotive Group's Walk with L'Arche** will take place on Sunday May 5th, 2019 at Oxford Heights Community Club, 359 Dowling Ave. East in Transcona.

We hope many of you will join us for this year's walk and bring your family members and friends along. The walk not only raises funds for L'Arche, it is also about bringing together people with and without disabilities who can share an enjoyable afternoon together.

Check-in tables open at 12:30 p.m. on May 5^{th} and the Walk starts at 2:00 p.m. sharp. You can walk either 1 km or 5 km on the walking trail, and then return to the Club for food, music, and many prize draws.

Create a team by asking your friends and family to walk with you (minimum of 5 people required to be considered a team). Choose a team captain and a team name. You can request a T-shirt with your team name on it. Each team member needs to raise their own minimum \$50.00 of pledges to get the T-shirt, and must submit that amount with their registration form & registration fees to the L'Arche office by **Friday, April 5th.**

"Celebrate the Gift" - L'Arche Canada On-line Art Exhibition

C elebrate the Gift is an on-line art exhibition that begins a year-long celebration of the 50th anniversary of l'Arche in Canada.

The L'Arche Canada Art Exhibition features works by 31 artists with intellectual disabilities from each of the L'Arche communities in nine provinces. The artwork was selected by the community to express the theme *Celebrate the Gift: belonging, diversity, and inclusion.*

An introduction at the art website states that "art opens a window into how others see and understand the world. This art exhibit opens our eyes to seeing the world from the mind and heart of a people who often are ignored, people labelled intellectually disabled. Note the lines, the vibrancy of the colour and the movement displayed in the art. Each artist has much to share."

Canadian Jean Vanier started l'Arche in Trosly-Breuil, France, in 1964. Five years later, Canada became the 2nd country to have a l'Arche home when *Daybreak* opened in Toronto. Today there are nearly 200 homes and workshops or day programs in 29 communities and 2 projects across Canada.

Remembering Clive

Clive Molyneux passed away on January 19, 2019 at the age of 64. Clive had lived at L'Arche Winnipeg for 45 years, having come as a 19 year-old in January, 1974. Below are excerpts from 3 of Clive's close friends who spoke at his funeral service on January 25th.

live is the most dignified person I ✓ have ever met. I have learned a lot from him about what is important in life. He was very comfortable with who he was, and did not infringe on anyone else's right to be themselves. Richard Rohr, in his book Immortal Diamond, talks about the True Self and the False Self. The True Self is the Spirit of God living within each one of us. That Spirit is both unique to each one of us and universal. The False Self is our ego, giving us a false sense of our own importance, and judging others. More than anyone I have known, Clive lived in his True Self. He was kind and compassionate to others. I never felt judged by him. Akech told me that, when she lived in his home, one day he came into her messy room, looked around, shook his head with maybe a hint of disgust, and walked out. Both Akech and I agreed that he was judging her room, not her...

Several years ago, Clive's house leader invited me to accompany him to Disney World for a week, with six other members of L'Arche Winnipeg. We had a very good time together. But as many of us know there is L'Arche time, which means we are often late, and then there is Clive time. Near the end of our stay, Clive was being particularly slow in getting ready to go to the bus that would take us to another part of Disney World. In retrospect I don't why, but I tried to hurry him up with signs and gestures. He looked at me calmly and touched me gently on the shoulder to let me know I needed to relax. I got the message. We took a later bus...

Bob Jones emailed me this comment about Clive a few days ago: "Clive was a true original. I have met very few people who, with a small repertoire of looks, could communicate what needed to be communicated as he did! The community can celebrate that at L'Arche, he found his place to live out much of life... valued....respected.... and, by many who knew him, well loved."

ver the years, I learned a lot from Oclive about being true to myself. The weekend we met, I remember watching him from afar, intrigued by the manner in which he was able to adequately communicate, through facial expressions and sign language. Yet those of us who use words often find ourselves stumbling in our ability to communicate with each other. Clive taught me how to communicate what was essential, from the heart, with love and laughter. As well as being able to make his needs known through his self -developed sign language, I very quickly observed Clive to have a keen sense of humour. With a smile on his face and a twinkle in his eye, he appeared quite skilled as a mime artist, almost comparable, in my opinion, to Marcel Marceau, often entertaining us with his antics...

I believe that Clive was a gift from God, given to me and Roger and our families, and to all who were privileged to encounter his presence. He was a man of few words, but when he did speak, it was always profound. He was a Spiritual man and his simple *Grace* before meals said it all. With his eyes closed and his hands folded in prayer, he would nod his head and clearly articulate the most sacred of words, "Holy Man." Clive was a Holy Man. He was a gift given to us, an Angel on earth, and now, I believe he is a Heavenly Angel... You will be missed by so many, but will always live on in our hearts, as we remember the great joy you brought to us while you walked among us.

December Performances Raise \$3,742.00 for Solidarity





Update on Jean Vanier's Health

Jean, who turned 90 last September, has since then suffered a loss of his voice, which led to surgery on his thyroid. In the following January 2019 letter from Jean, he gives an update on his health.

My dear brothers and sisters of L'Arche and Faith and Light, and all those with whom I am united in mind and heart,

First of all, I would like to thank you for accompanying me with your prayer and friendship in the intervention operation that has just taken place and that went well.

It was during this operation that they removed a little bit of my thyroid and discovered a cancer that it was hidden there. I was strongly advised to have some radiotherapy to prevent the cancer from growing any further.

The doctors prescribed about fifteen sessions for me. They explained to me all the side effects, in the hope that I could regain my life as before. I am aware that these side effects can be a

little painful and I am counting on you to continue to support me in this descent into fragility. I know that this is also where I will discover our God of humility and gentleness.

During this whole period, which could last two months, I will stay in Paris in the apartment that L'Arche in France and a friend have generously rented for me and I will always be accompanied during this time by Odile, Annick from Belgium, and Christine. During this time of growing weakness I will have very few visits, but I know that you visit me through your prayer and your support.

Above all, I wanted to thank you for being with me in your thoughts and in your hearts. I will surely need your help during the more difficult times, but I feel happy to do what I can so that the kingdom of God, the kingdom of love, can grow on earth through my offering.
